PRICES HEREIN ARE FOR THE TRADE ONLY and cancel all previous prices offered by us. Prices are based on present market conditions and are subject to change without notice. All prices FOB Portland, Oregon.

VOLUME DISCOUNTS: We offer a volume rate depending on amount of material purchased.

TERMS: Net 30 days from date of invoice to those of established credit or whose responsibility is known to us. A late payment charge of 1.5% per month (which is a true annual rate of 18%) will be made after 30 days on unpaid balances. Any allowances are applicable only when terms of sale are met.

CLAIMS: We guarantee all nursery stock to be in good condition when shipped. Any unsatisfactory stock must be reported immediately and held for advice from us as to disposition. We do not guarantee plants to live after accepted in good condition and will at no time be responsible for more than the purchase price. All claims must be made within five (5) days of receipt of stock.

DISPUTES: In the event a dispute arises as to the enforcement of the terms of this agreement, Motz and Son shall be entitled to all costs including attorney fees whether or not legal action is initiated. Oregon law shall govern all terms of our agreement and should it become necessary to file suit with regard to this agreement, such suit must be brought in the County of Multnomah, State of Oregon.

GUARANTEE: We give no warranty, express or implied, as to life, description, quality, productiveness or any other matter of any nursery stock or plants that we sell. It is mutually agreed that our total liability for any error, should any prove untrue to name as labeled, shall be limited, upon satisfactory proof, to our replacing free or refunding the purchase price thereof. We accept all orders subject to crop conditions, errors in counts, and with the understanding that the same shall be void should injury befall the stock because of hail, fire, frost or other causes beyond our control. We reserve the right to ship one grade size substitute. This guarantee is not transferable and is void if payment of the contract price for the nursery stock shipped is not made in full when due.

CANCELLATIONS: All cancellations or substitutions must be received in writing no later than January 1st. All cancellations after January 1st are subject to 10% restocking charge.

SHIPPING: We reserve the right to refuse acceptance of an order if it is too small to meet shipping requirements. If the order is below 250 units, we will not be able to ship your order. You may pick up your order or arrange your own shipping for these items. No charge for packing car or truck loads. We pack all of our stock with the greatest of care and our responsibility ceases when the stock is delivered to the carrier. We are not liable for delays in transit. Invoicing of freight charges is separate from plant material invoicing. Federal ICC regulations dictate payment of freight charges within seven (7) days of invoicing. Our truck broker provides a prepaid freight service on the assumption that ICC regulations will be observed.

FRUIT TREES

APPLE, DWARF AND SEMI-DWARF

* Akane: Mid-harvest season. Tree has a large crown like the Jonathan. Fruit is small and flat. Skin color is bright red. Apple is firm, crisp and has a slightly acid taste. Excellent dessert apple. Bears early in age. Not a good keeper. Zone 4-9.

Ambrosia: Early to mid-harvest season. Sweet flavor, low acid, with crisp texture that requires chilling after harvesting to maintain texture. Color is a beautiful orange/pink flush over a yellow base. Tree is compact in size with upright growing pattern. Discovered in Canada in 1990 in a Jonagold orchard. Zone 4-8.

- * Beverly Hills: Early-harvest season. Tree is medium size and vigorous. Fruit is small to medium. Skin is pale yellow splashed with red. Flesh is tender, juicy and somewhat tart. Good for cooking. Zone 5-10.
- * Braeburn: Late-harvest season. Excellent flavor, mildly sweet and aromatic with firm; crisp and juicy texture. Very late maturing with excellent storage life. Zone 5-8.
- * Chehalis: Early-harvest season. Tree is upright and spreading. Fruit is large. Skin color is greenish yellow with pink blush. Apple is crisp and juicy. It is good for desserts and cooking. Very resistant to scab. Zone 5-9.
- * Cortland: Late-harvest season. Tree is strong, spreading and drooping. Fruit is large and somewhat flat. Skin is red. Flesh is crisp, tender and juicy. Stores well. Zone 4-6.

Criterion: Mid-harvest season. Skin is yellow with red blush. Flavor is sweet. Use for fresh eating or cider. Zone 5-8.

* Empire: Mid-harvest season. Tree is large and upright. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is dark red with stripes. Apple is crisp and juicy, somewhat sweet, much like the McIntosh. Stores well and is very good for fresh eating. Requires a pollinizer. Zone 4-7.

Freedom: Late-harvest season. Apple is orange-red with a yellow-green striping with some patches of netted russet. Flesh is fine, juicy with a sub acid flavor. High disease resistance. Zone 4-8.

* Fuji: Late-harvest season. Tree is vigorous and very productive. The skin is straw colored with a red blush. Flavor is a balance between sweet and tart. Long shelf life. Zone 4-8.

- * Gala: Mid-harvest season. Tree is large. Skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi sweet. Apple is excellent quality. Keeps very well. Zone 4-8.
- * Granny Smith: Late-harvest season. Tree is upright and spreading. Fruit is large. Skin color is bright green with white dots. Apple is tart and juicy. Good for fresh eating and for sauces. Good keeper. Zone 5-9.
- * Gravenstein: Early-harvest season. Tree is upright and spreading. Fruit is medium to large. Skin color is light green with red stripes. Apple has fine texture and is crisp and juicy. It is good for cooking and fresh eating. Requires pollinizer. Pollen sterile. Zone 2-9.
- * Haralson: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Fruit is medium size, red and juicy. The tree bears a good crop at an early age and has a firm flesh with a good flavor. Fruit keeps well. Zone 3-8.

Honeycrisp: (Plant Patent #7179) Mid-harvest season. Fruit is large size. Skin color fluorescent red. Apple has a sweet-tart flavor. Red Delicious and Snowdrift Crab are good pollinizers. Add \$1.25 to the price for each tree purchased in Canada. Zone 3-8.

Honeygold: Mid-harvest season. Tree is a cross of Yellow Delicious and Haralson. Fruit is medium size. Skin yellow with russet dots. Apple is crisp, juicy and has a very good flavor. Zone 3-7.

- * Jonagold: Late-harvest season. Tree is sturdy. Fruit large. Skin color yellow/green with red stripes. Apple has coarse texture and is crisp and juicy. Good for all cooking. Stores well. Requires pollinizer. Pollen sterile. Zone 4-8.
- * Jonathan: Mid-harvest season. Tree is small. Fruit is small to medium. Skin color is red. Apple is firm and crisp with a tart taste. Zone 4-8.
- * King: Late-harvest season. Tree is fast growing. Fruit is very large. Skin color red. Apple has coarse texture, is firm and sweet. Good for baking and stores well. Zone 4-7.
- * Liberty: Late-harvest season. Skin color is red. Apple is crisp and juicy, somewhat tart. Good for fresh eating. Scab free. Requires a pollinizer. Zone 4-7
- * Lodi: Early-harvest season. Tree is large and hardy. Fruit is large. Skin color greenish yellow, also very thick. Apple is soft and tart. Good for sauce and pies. Zone 4-8.

- * Macoun: Late-harvest season. Tree is upright with low branches. Fruit is small. Skin color dark red. Apple has a rich flavor and is very aromatic. Very good for desserts. Good storage life. Zone 4-8.
- * Melrose: Late-harvest season. Tree grows to medium height and is upright. Fruit is medium to large in size. Skin color yellow with bright red blush, looks much like Jonathan. Apple is crisp and juicy. Good for cooking. Good keeper. Zone 4-9.
- * Mutsu/Crispin: Late-harvest season. Tree is large. Fruit is very large. Skin color is green, turning to yellow as it matures with an orange blush. Apple is coarse in texture, firm and juicy. Good for cooking and baking. Requires pollinizer. Pollen sterile. Zone 4-8.
- * Northern Spy: Late-harvest season. Apple is large, yellow and is almost totally covered with bright red oversplash with a darker red stripe. Excellent flavor very crisp and juicy. Zone 4-8.

Pink Lady® Brand Cripps Pink Variety: Late-harvest season. Fruit is oblong with pink blush over yellow overtone. Flesh is creamy white. Flavor is sweet-tart. Long storage life. Add \$1.00 to the price for each tree. Zone 5-8.

* Pink Pearl: Early-harvest season. Fruit is yellow-green skin with a bright pink flesh. Taste is tart. Apple is crisp and juicy. Great for making pink applesauce. Zone 4-8.

Prairie Spy: Late-harvest season. Fruit is large, firm and is excellent for baking and a good keeper. Tree is vigorous and productive. Zone 3-9.

Prima: Early-harvest season. Tree is moderately vigorous. Fruit is medium to large. Yellow skin often blushed with dark red. Flesh is white and juicy. Good for cooking. Requires other early blooming variety for pollinizer. Disease resistant. Zone 4-8.

* Red Delicious: Mid-harvest season. Tree is large and upright. Fruit is medium size. Skin color is red with stripes. Apple is juicy, sweet tasting and aromatic. Requires pollinizer. Zone 4-8.

Red Fuji: Late-harvest season. Fruit is red. Flesh is crisp and juicy. Taste is sweet and great for fresh eating and baking. Zone 5-8.

- * Sweet Sixteen: Mid-harvest season. Cold-hardy apple with a unique yellow-red flesh and sugar sweet flavor. Perfect for fresh eating. Resistant to scab and blight. Zone 4-7. Requires pollinizer.

NEW Triumph Apple™: Mid-harvest season. Fruit is firm, pleasantly tart with beautiful red color and occassional stem bowl russeting. Scab tolerant, good storage life, and tasty for fresh eating. Triumph has two forms of genetic scab resistance and is suitable for Zone 4. The latest from University of Minnesota breeding program (creators of Honeycrisp).

- * Wealthy: Mid-harvest season. Tree is open and spreading. Fruit is large. Skin is deep red. Flesh is white, firm with fine grain and juicy. Good cooking variety. Cold hardy. Zone 4-8.
- * Winesap: Late-harvest season. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is yellow with red stripes. Apple is crisp and juicy with a coarse texture. Good for canning. Keeps well. Requires pollinizer. Zone 5-8.

Pound Sweet: Late-harvest season. Fruit is large in size. Skin is light to dark green with whitish cast. Peculiar, sweet flavor. Good for baking and canning. Zone 4-8

Snow Famuse: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Bright red skin, pure white flesh, sometimes streaked red. Crisp, aromatic, juicy. One of the oldest varieties. Excellent for fresh eating or desserts, not for cooking. Grows best at high elevations. Zone 3-10.

Summer Rambo: Summer apple. Skin is greenish with a red blush. Good cooking apple. Zone 4-8

* Wolf River: Early-harvest season. Tree is a strong, hardy and spreading grower. Skin color is red. Apple is very large. Zone 3-8

APRICOT, DWARF AND SEMI-DWARF

* Blenheim/Royal: Early-to-mid-harvest season. Tree is very productive. Fruit is large. Skin color is light orange with blush. Apricot is sweet and firm. Good for all uses. Zone 5-8.

Chinese Mormon: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Tree is medium in size and is spreading. Fruit is small. Skin color is orange with a red blush. Apricot is smooth in texture and is very sweet and juicy. This apricot does well in late frost areas. Tree bears young. Zone 4-7.

Goldcot: Early-harvest season. Fruit is medium to large freestone. Skin color is golden yellow. Vey early bloomer. Zone 4-8.

Plum Cot: Mid-harvest season. A cross between a plum and an apricot. Tree resembles plum. Fruit is the size of a medium apricot with pinkish orange skin. Dark red flesh. Zone 5-9.

- * Puget Gold: Late-harvest season. Tree bears prolifically. Fruit is large and good flavor. Freestone. Partially self-fertile. Zone 5-9.
- * Tilton: Mid-harvest season. Tree bears heavy. Fruit is very large. Skin color is orange. Apricot has a good flavor when eaten fresh. Zone 5-8.
- * Wenatchee-Moorpark: Mid-harvest season. Tree bears annually. Fruit is large and oval, somewhat flattened. Skin color is orange and yellow. Apricot has good flavor. Good in the Northwest. Zone 5-9.
- * Westley: A freestone, medium to large apricot with vibrant, orange flesh. High quality with sweet flavor. Tree is largeand productive, a regular bearer. Recommended use in canning, drying and fresh eating. Zone 4-9.

SOUR CHERRY, SEMI DWARF AND STANDARD

Early Richmond: Early-harvest season. Tree is medium size. Fruit has bright red skin. Tart flavor. Especially hardy. Zone 4-9.

- * Meteor: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Tree is genetic dwarf that reaches only about 10' tall. Fruit is a large, bright red pie cherry with clear yellow flesh. Very hardy. Zone 4-8.
- * Montmorency: Mid-harvest season. Tree is hardy and produces heavily with medium to large spread. Fruit is large. Skin color is bright red. Cherry's flavor is tart. The best pie cherry. Used commercially. Zone 4-7.

North Star: Early-harvest season. Tree is slow growing and hardy. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is bright red. Cherry is tart. Great for pies. Resistant to cracking and brown rot. Zone 4-8.

SWEET CHERRY, SEMI-DWARF AND STANDARD

- * Bing: Mid-harvest season. Tree produces heavy crop and has spreading growth. Fruit is top quality and large. Skin color is dark burgundy red. Cherry is meaty, sweet and juicy. Excellent for canning. Requires pollinizer. Zone 5-8.
- * Black Republican: Abundant crop of dark, sweet red fruit with distinctive flavor. Very hardy, requires pollinizer. Zone 5. A rare find and the parent of Bing Cherry. Zone 5-8.
- * Black Tartarian: Early-harvest season. Tree grows quickly and is very productive. Fruit is medium size. Skin color is bright purplish black. Cherry is firm and sweet. One of the earliest cherries. Pollinizer could be any sweet cherry. Zone 5-9.

Kristin: Dark cherry. Crack resistant. Heavy producer. Zone 4-8.

- * Lambert: Early-harvest season. Tree blooms late with vigorous growth. Fruit is large. Skin color is black. Cherry is firm and sweet. Outstanding for fresh eating. Pollinizers could be Sam or Van. Zone 5-8.
- * Lapins: Early-harvest season. Fruit is large, dark and firm. Excellent flavor and texture. Semi-fertile sweet cherry. Zone 5-9.
- * Rainier: Early-harvest season. Tree is upright and productive. Fruit is shaped like a Bing. Skin is yellow with red blush. Cherry is firm and sweet. Pollinizer suggested Bing, Sam and Van. Zone 5-8.

- * Sam: Mid-harvest season. Tree is hardy and bears early. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is shiny and dark. Cherry is much like the Bing but more tart. Tree bears heavy and is resistant to cracking. Pollinizers suggested are Bing, Lambert, and Royal Ann. Zone 5-9.
- * Stella: Mid-harvest season. Skin and flesh is black. Cherry is sweet and juicy. Semi-fertile sweet cherry. Zone 5-8.

Sweetheart™: Late-harvest season. Tree is upright and a vigorous grower. Fruit is a large and bright red. Tree is self-fertile. Zone 5-8.

* Van: Mid-harvest season. Tree is hardy and bears early. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is shiny dark. Cherry much like the Bing but more tart. Tree bears heavy and is resistant to cracking. Pollinizers suggested are Bing, Lambert and Royal Ann. Zone 5-8.

NECTARINE, SEMI-DWARF

- * Fantasia: Mid-harvest season. Tree is vigorous with a nice looking flower. Fruit is large and oval in shape. Skin color is yellow with an overlay of red. Nectarine is a freestone and is firm with a smooth texture; taste is tart. Zone 5-9.
- * Flavortop: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Skin is bright yellow with red blush. Flesh is firm, juicy and smooth. Excellent flavor for fresh eating. Freestone. Zone 5-9.

Goldmine: Late-harvest season. Tree is a very good producer. Fruit is large. Skin color is white with red blush. Nectarine is freestone. Good for fresh eating. Zone 5-9.

* Hardired: Mid-harvest season. Fruit is medium size with red blush on yellow skin. Resistant to bacterial leaf spot. Nectarine is freestone. Good for fresh eating. Hardy. Zone 5-8

Sunglo Nectarine: The queen of nectarines. Pink blossoms in the spring with large, freestone fruit. Cold hardy. Zone 5-8.

White Tiger Nectarine: A cold hardy nectarine with pink blossoms in the spring. Fruit is dark red with white flesh. The name comes from the red stripes coming from the center stone. Delicious. Zone 5-8.

PEAR, DWARF AND SEMI-DWARF

- * Anjou: Mid-harvest season. Tree is upright and slow bearing. Fruit is large. Skin color is light green. Pear has fine texture and is mild and juicy. Very good for fresh eating. Zone 5-8.
- * Bartlett: Early-harvest season. Vigorous tree. Fruit medium to large. Skin color green and ripens to a yellow. Pear is sweet and tender. Good for fresh eating and canning. Ripens without cold storage. Zone 5-8.
- * Bosc: Mid-harvest season. Tree is large with upright growth. Fruit is large and narrow shaped with a long neck. Skin color is dark yellow with russet. Pear is juicy, sweet and tender. Good for canning, and fresh eating. Zone 5-8.
- * Clapps Favorite: Mid-harvest season. Pear is medium to large. Color is yellow. Pear is sweet, aromatic and very juicy. Great for fresh eating. Zone 5-7.
- * Comice: Late-harvest season. Tree is large and slow to bear fruit. Fruit is large. Skin color is yellow with russet dots. Pear is sweet, tender and aromatic. Best winter pear. Requires cold storage to ripen. Zone 5-8.
- * Conference: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Fruit has a distinctive long, tapering shape. Crops are very heavy. Does well in areas that are wet and cooler than other pears. Great for fresh eating. Self-fertile. Zone 4-10.
- * Flemish Beauty: Early-to-mid-harvest season. Tree is hardy. Fruit is medium to large, rounded in shape. Skin color is yellow with red blush. Pear is sweet. Zone 4-8.
- * Kieffer: Late-harvest season. Fruit is medium to large in size. Skin color is yellow with a red blush. Flesh is white and is crisp and coarse. Excellent for cooking and canning. Stores well. Zone 4-9.
- * Luscious: Mid-to-late-harvest season. Small fruit with yellowish green skin. Pear is very juicy, sweet and firm. Tree is hardy and resistant to fire blight. Zone 4-7.

* Moonglow: Mid-harvest season. Tree is vigorous upright. Fruit is large. Flesh is soft, juicy and low acid. Stores well. Blight resistant. Zone 5-9.

Orcus: Large fruit ripening in mid-September. Yellow with blush on the skin. Smooth flesh. Good pick for canning and drying. Zone 5-9.

Parker: Mid-harvest season. Larger pear. Color is yellow-bronze. Fine grain, tender and juicy. Zone 4-8.
